#### Life In the Tribe



A couple of weeks ago I was in Washington, DC for the United Methodist Association of Ministers with Disabilities (UMAMD) for the Disabilities Leadership Academy at Gallaudet University.

The workshop was great; one of those events where each great segment was topped by the segment that followed. I was grateful to glean much from our gifted presenters, but even more blessed just to be able to gather, once again, with my UMAMD tribe. In this tribe I have found welcome, hospitality, grace, and empowerment.

Like you, I belong to many "tribes" as I go about living my life. Different ones influence me at different times and, truth be told, there might even be times when we struggle to figure out which of our tribes calls for our greatest loyalty. The Apostle Paul certainly knew this struggle well.

In his theological treatise to the Romans, Paul is sharing how membership in one tribe doesn't necessarily threaten membership in another. In celebrating his relationship with Jesus Christ he continues to identify himself with his roots in the tribe of Benjamin.

But he also offers some further clarification in his Epistle to the Galatians where he offers up that famous observation of "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male of female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." (3:28 NRSV). Even though we may belong to a variety of different spiritual tribes, our oneness in Jesus somehow celebrates them all. Progressives, liberals, moderates, conservatives, fundamentalists and the like can be tribal in nature, yet are still part of the Oneness in Christ. Even if particular tribes don't see eye to eye, the eyes of all can be focused on our Togetherness in Christ.

Are you and I spiritually mature enough to be tribal yet together? Are you and I willing to embrace that we have much to learn from those of different tribes? Or is ignorantly living in the arrogant hope that our "tribe" is the one that possesses all truth?

Our tribes have much to share with one another. May we find a common table at which to sit and discuss our common bond to Jesus Christ.
