Pastor's Page

So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions. ---- Luke 14:33

There is nothing like launching into a new year of hope and possibility than with a real downer of a text.

By "downer," I mean this teaching of Jesus which indicates that our discipleship is at risk if we don't disperse with all our possessions. Just think about it, no house, no car, not a single luxury. It's almost more than this middle-aged heart of mine can stand!

I really do think I am entitled to enjoy my possessions, for I have worked quite hard to obtain them. They are things that I have – for the most part – been able to deem "necessities," although that may be stretching things just a bit. Yes, I need shelter – but could make do with much less than I have now. Transportation is a good thing, but I could get by with a few less "bells and whistles" (e.g. heated seats) in "my ride." Food is necessary; a nightly diet of lobster and caviar is not. Health care, furnishings, clothing, rejuvenation; the list can go on and on.

For whatever reason, I've been blessed beyond what I could ever possibly imagine and – here's the kicker – most times I feel totally entitled to what I have and more.

Jesus said to be wary of these so-called "entitlements" because, at the end of the day, they are impediments to our true purpose of being his disciples.

When we wonder why the church in the third world is exploding with new members while the American Christian movement is shrinking, perhaps the best reason is that the people in the third world countries don't have all the stuff to worry about that we first-world folks do. Their possessions are few and fragile, so they have to put their hope in something else other than a display of financial success.

What would happen if we were challenged to give up all our possessions so that we could fully pursue our discipleship journey? Would we? Could we?

Through the grace of God, I hope to never have to really come to that point. But if possessions are becoming impediments to my discipleship, then I need to rethink the value of some of the stuff I hold so dear.

If you had to let some of that stuff go to deepen your relationship with the Savior, would you be able to?
